ENSO (Energy Network South-East, Province of Styria, Austria) integrates the concept of Sustainable Development into its network-strategy, thus considering its members' and clients' economic and social interests.

Aligning all aims and measures with a sustainable guiding vision forms the basis of every positive, long-ranging, futureoriented development. This is true on every level - no matter if single companies or whole economies are concerned. Sustainable Development is as topical as ever because this concept allows to satisfy current needs while simultaneously safeguarding that future generations will also be able to meet their demands.

Sustainability means offering the best solution - in an ecological, social, technical and economic sense. Global challenges in the next decades to come will call for economies to produce technologies, products and services that meet the requirements of a sustainable future.

All this motivated more than 170 countries to commit themselves to the concept of sustainable development at the UN conference on Environment and Development in Rio de Janeiro in 1992. Ten years later the commitment was confirmed and enhanced in Johannesburg, this time with active participation of the private sector. Only recently the European Union has passed a sustainability strategy and thus has shown its dedication to a sound and balanced environmental. economic and social development. Austria's commitment to this European process is outlined in its own national strategy on sutainable development. On provincial level Styria is the leading region in Austria. With its programme on ecological reform Styria has actually started to integrate the principles of sustainability into all policy sectors.


